ID AYU0113) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 09 seats in 03 PG courses subject namely (i) Shalyatantra- 03 seats (ii) Kayachikitsa- 03 seats (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 03 seats, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 1st Renewal of Permision for 01 PG course with intake capacity of 03 seats in the subject namely Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana – 03 seats, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26-reg.

Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **to Poomulli Neelakandan Namboodiripad Memorial Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Cheruthuruthy P.O. Shoranur, Thalappilly, Taluk, Thrissur District-679531, Kerala (Inst. ID AYU0113)** inspection was conducted on **20.03.2025 & 21.03.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Asessment and Rating Board for **Indian System of Medicine, NCISM** to process **the permission 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 12 seats in 04 PG courses subject namely (i) Shalyatantra- 03 seats (ii) Kayachikitsa- 03 seats (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 03 seats (iv) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana – 03 seats under section 28 & 29 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate and Postgraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024 and Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda Regulations 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria, due to the following shortcoming:**

1. Teaching departments:- Computer and printer are **not available** in Medical Superintendent office.

2. Hospital staffs:-

a) Availability of hospital staff is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{58}{70} \times 100\% = 82.85\%$. (Excluding part-time Modern Medical Staffs)

3. Other infrastructure details:-

- a) Animal house is **not available. MOU is not attached.**
- b) Central research laboratory is **not available.**

4. Mean of general and essential equipment's/instruments availability is 73.50%.

5. Observation by the visitors:-

- a) Labour and OT section was non functional.
- b) There were no separate cabins for faculties in few departments.
- c) Records are not maintained properly in any section.
- d) No system for ODL application so unable to submit it.
- e) FSSAI license for canteen was expired.
- f) Non functional screening OPD.
- g) No separate compartments for Vaman, virechan, Basti Kaksha.
- h) No central store for hospital building.
- i) OT medicines are not as per stock register.
- j) Medicines are not as per Stock register in medicines store room.
- k) Digital library is having only 02 computers.
- l) Nidan specimens and instruments were kept in Kriya department.
- m) Attendance register are not matching with annexure as staff is replaced after submission of Part-1.

3. The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report have been carefully re-examined in terms concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of competent authority the assessment report along with clarification report was placed in the **124th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **29.05.2025 and On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, the Board discussed and decided to provide an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARB-ISM letter (Hearing notice) of even number dated 18.07.2025 to appear before the designated Hearing Committee on 22.07.2025, to present their case and to show cause as to why not the permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 12 seats in 04 PG courses subject namely (i) Shalyatantra- 03 seats (ii) Kayachikitsa- 03 seats (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 03 seats (iv) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana – 03 seats under section 28 & 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2025-26. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter no. PNNM/A1/NCISM/213/2025 hearing, dated 22.07.2025 against the deficiencies conveyed to them.**

4. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Gigi Mathew, Principal and Radheesh PG dean of the College**, appeared before the Hearing Committee on **14.07.2025** and made their submission virtually as well as written, against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

5. Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and the assessment report was duly placed before the **136th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine **for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 24.07.2025 and Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the concerned acts and regulation but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letters issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Further, the Board also**

observed that the college is meeting the notified & requisite approved criteria for the issuance of the Extended Permission in accordance with regulation 54(2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, as the college has been permitted for last three consecutive years with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 09 seats in 03 PG courses namely (i) Shalyatantra- 03 seats (ii) Kayachikitsa- 03 seats (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 03 seats without any punitive action under section 28 (1) (f) of Ncism Act 2020 and board also observed that the college is not fulfilling the criteria for Extended Permission in accordance with regulation 54(2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, as the LOP was issued to the college for 1 PG course with intake capacity of 3 seats namely (i) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana – 03 seats was issued to the college for the academic year 2024-25. Accordingly, the Board decided as follows:

- a) To issue extended permission in UG with 60 seats in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 as per the provision under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.
- b) To issue Extended Permission in PG with intake capacity of 09 seats in 03 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Shalyatantra- 03 seats (ii) Kayachikitsa- 03 seats (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 03 seats in accordance with Regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations 2024, as per the provision under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.
- c) To issue 1st Renewal of Permission in PG with intake capacity of 03 Seats in 01 PG course in the subject namely (i) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana – 03 seats in accordance with Regulation 45(4) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations 2024, as per the provision under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.

"DECISION"

6. Therefore, Poomulli Neelakandan Namboodiripad Memorial Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Cheruthuruthy P.O. Shoranur, Thalappilly, Taluk, Thrissur District-679531, Kerala (Inst. ID AYU0113) is hereby granted with:-
 - a) Extended Permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 60 seats for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and;
 - b) Extended Permission in 09 seats in 03 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Shalyatantra- 03 seats (ii) Kayachikitsa- 03 seats (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 03 seats for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 15 (5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024;
 - c) 1st Renewal of Permission in 01 PG course with intake capacity of 03 Seats in the subjects namely (i) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana – 03 seats for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 45(4) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024;
7. The aforementioned Permission is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-
 - I. It is informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 60 seats and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 12 Seats in each 04 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
9. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards

as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**

10. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
11. **You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
12. **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
 - iv) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - v) The compliance of shortcoming mentioned in para- 04
13. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
